FROM THE PRINCIPALS

Happy holidays to all of our students and families. The July winter holidays come at a perfect time for us. Our students are exhausted after a hectic semester and with this cold weather, many are starting to succumb to a variety of sore throats and colds. It is a great time to have a rest and recharge the batteries.

This is also a great time for students to read through reports and reflect on their progress for 2017 so far. This is an opportunity to look at what they have done well and make some plans about how they can continue this progress. They can also look at areas where they may not have achieved as well as they would have liked, and set themselves some real goals for improvement. If their maths isn't quite as strong as they would like, do they need to dedicate 15 minutes per day of the holidays towards learning all of their times tables? Or spend some time on Mathletics daily, in order to improve their automaticity of basic facts? Perhaps they are struggling to express their ideas well in their writing? They could benefit from finding a riveting novel to read over the break. These are simple, helpful things to do, even when families are taking off for the holidays.

There are many rumours circulating at the moment about the Deaf school moving. I would like to take a moment to clarify these rumours. It is true that there are preliminary investigations occurring to determine whether Mosman Park is the best place for the Deaf School to be located for the next years to come. These are very preliminary however, and I would like to stress that there has not been a decision made to move the school at this time.

The two main reasons for a possible relocation are space and location. In regards to space, both Mosman Park Primary School and Mosman Park School for Deaf Children are finding the need for more and more space to run our programs, however in such a thriving school, this is very hard to come by. In terms of location, many people don't know that our Deaf children travel from all across the metropolitan area. Currently they are travelling from as far as Mandurah and Byford to attend the only Deaf school in WA. Whilst Mosman Park is an amazing location which we are blessed to share with MPPS, it is not necessarily the easiest area to access when students are coming from such diverse locations. With both of these considerations in mind, the Education Department will be reviewing to see if there is possibly a location which can better serve the needs of our students.

It is important to know that these investigations are only preliminary and a relocation of the Deaf School is not a definite conclusion. Alison and I will keep all parents informed of updates about this as we hear them. In the meantime we are 100% committed to the partnerships we have operating at Mossie Park and continue to plan towards the future.

Again, we wish our families all the best for the holidays and look forward to seeing everyone back at school next term, ready for the next round!

NEW EPIPEN GUIDELINES

The Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ascia - www.allergy.org.au) have formulated new Anaphylaxis action plans to reflect the new guidelines for the use of an EpiPen/EpiPen jnr. The instruction is now to "Push down hard until a click is heard or felt and to hold in place for 3 seconds." There is also no need to massage the area after injection.

The explanation can be found at the following link <https://www.allergy.org.au/about-ascia/info-updates/707-3-second-epipen-s-are-now-available>. Please have a conversation with your child about the changes so they are also aware (as is age appropriate). All EpiPens should be held in place for 3 seconds regardless of instructions on the device label. Old EpiPen stock will be used up at pharmacies but the new guidelines should be adhered to.
