## FROM THE PRINCIPALS

### Nominations for School Board positions

Since the school was awarded Independent Public School status in 2013, the Mosman Park Primary School Board has played a significant role in guiding the strategic direction of our school and has ensured that the voice of our community is represented in key decision-making practices. Over this time our School Board has benefited from having parents with a variety of skills and interests and who have children from varying year level ranges.

We are expecting up to four vacancies on our School Board for the commencement of the 2019 school year. In order to fill these representative positions nominations are now being invited from interested parents. All parents of a child enrolled at Mosman Park Primary School are eligible for nomination. Membership on the Board is for three years, formally beginning in Term 1 2019. The Board meets regularly throughout the school year – usually a minimum of twice per school term.

All nominations include a personal statement of approximately 150 words and are to be **returned to the School Principal by 4pm Monday, 29 Oct 2018**. Please email your nomination to [Alison.Robb@education.wa.edu.au](mailto:Alison.Robb@education.wa.edu.au) or drop off to the school office.

- Mindfulness



## ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

At Mosman Park Primary School we want your child to achieve their very best. To get the best education, they need to attend school every day.

Developing a habit of going to school every day is vitally important so your child does not miss out on important ideas and skills they need for future learning.

### Why is going to school so important for my child?

At school, many concepts such as literacy and numeracy are taught in a sequence. Missing school means missing out on learning – which can often make it difficult to catch up later. This is particularly important when essential foundation skills are being taught.

Going to school every day helps children learn the important life skill of 'showing up' – at school, at work, to sport and other commitments.

Research from the Western Australian Telethon Kids Institute shows that every day at school counts towards a student's learning. Students who attend more, generally do better at school.

Please let the class teacher know the reason why your child is going to be, or has been, absent from school as soon as possible.

It is important to note that Primary school children who miss a day a week have missed a whole year of schooling by the end of year 4.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to ensure our attendance rates are improved and children are attending school regularly.
