Dear Parents and Caregivers

We are great at making mistakes.

At our Mosman Park Schools, we are so proud of the fact that our children make lots of mistakes. In fact, we work hard to provide our children with the opportunity to make mistakes every day. Please don't worry – we are not setting our students up for failure. It may seem quite surprising, but by allowing our children to make their own mistakes, we are setting them up for success. We ensure they are feeling safe and empowered every step of the way.

The fact that our children will have a go at a task when success is not guaranteed shows they are resilient and feel safe and supported.

Learning that mistakes are acceptable and we are not expected to be perfect, improves our confidence and decreases anxiety.

Thinking of another way to tackle the problem after making a mistake increases creativity and motivation in children. It also develops incredible problem solving abilities while it improves wisdom and good judgement.

Recognising and acknowledging that they have made a mistake helps to build responsibility, independence, and understanding that actions always have consequences.

All of these traits are ones which set up our children for successful lives, so we are making sure they start learning them early. This is why we are so proud of the fact that Mossie Park kids are great at making mistakes!

TECH TALK 6

Stop Motion for Beginners:

Stop motion animation is a film making technique that makes inanimate objects appear to move on their own. (Think Gumby or Wallace and Gromit.)

To make it work, you place an object in front of a camera and snap a photo. You then move the object a tiny bit and snap another photo. Repeat this process twenty to ten thousand times, play back the sequence in rapid progression, and the object appears to move fluidly across the screen.

I use the FREE version of *Stop Motion Studio* by Cateater for iOS

* Benefits of Stop Motion Animation


- Offers children ownership and autonomy in the film making process
- Teaches children how stop motion animation works
- Debunks the mechanics of how movie-making happens
- The creative constraint of the medium encourages problem solving
- It's a simple, hands-on technology that young children can achieve
- Encourages children to project and plan out where a story is heading
- Fosters iteration and experimentation through trying and testing
- Supports storytelling



Lego WeDo 2.0: Make coding come to life.

In some classes I have been teaching students how to use the Lego WeDo 2.0 kits. Through real-life STEM challenges and engaging physical and digital creation, WeDo 2.0 enables students to develop computational thinking skills and transform them directly into programming solutions that interact with the real world. The students have really enjoyed these lessons and link very well with the digital technology curriculum. Once they have built their robot and input the code for it to come to life, they can then video and save to seesaw. If you are not yet connected to your child's seesaw account and would like your child's specific QR code for access, ask the class teacher or see Mrs Anderson.


INTERSCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY
